Introduction & Objectives: Bladder neck dissection is one of the most demanding steps during Robot-Assisted Radical Prostatectomy (RARP). For beginners, this step involves many pitfalls with the risk of lesions of the prostate resulting in an oncological incomplete resection. Surgical injury can also affect the ureteric orifices or the wide open bladder neck requiring reconstruction, or damage the rectum.

Materials & Methods: In the following video sequences, we analyze the the bladder neck dissection during RARP step by step performed by a Surgeon with a high level of experience (>2800 RARP performed).

Results: Analyzing the bladder neck dissection step by step allows to point out some tips and tricks for beginners, e.g. the catheter jiggle test, the extend urethral preparation, and a repeated check of the posterior bladder wall.

Conclusions: Bladder neck dissection is complex and particularly difficult for beginners. The experience allows visual identification of the border of the prostate base and bladder neck, which is challenging for beginners. We provide some practical tips to identify the border of the prostate to improve oncological result and of the small bladder neck for a sufficient anastomosis.
